

A "PERFECT STORM" OF ERRORS CAUSED A GROSSLY WRONGFUL CONVICTION

The convergence of ten separate major errors/misconducts caused the Goodwin loss:

1. 51 material lies to the Judge & Jury (J&J) by the prosecutors, including in essentially sworn, offers of proof. One of the worst was told 10+ times.
2. 65 material perjuries by four State experts & two investigators, five of whom had inappropriate personal reasons to conjure an unjustified prosecution. Over two million dollars & prison time for some of them was at stake.
3. The investigators illegally suborned perjury from eight other witnesses.
4. The prosecutors (DDAS, Deputy District Attorneys) suppressed 250+ pieces of material exculpatory evidence, that is correct, 250+ BRADY VIOLATIONS plus DNA.
5. The DDAS suppressed 300+ witness statements for confirmed interviews. BARNETT V. SPR. CT. (2010) 50 Cal 4th 890, 5/ Cal Rptr 3d 283, 295, 306 requires that all of these witness statements be produced. It appears 100 more are suppressed.
6. The DDAS suppressed extensive other evidence which they were obligated to produce to facilitate defense cross exam, e.g. they produced none of the evidence on which the experts relied to develop their opinions, 120+ boxes of records. Law is absolute that all of this must be produced.
7. The correct law was not introduced as to financial allegations supporting motive, either via jury instructions or an expert's testimony, and the DDAS consistently materially misstated the law re: these allegations.
8. The defendant's actions which had been determined in the past by Courts of competent & correct jurisdiction as legal & legitimate were postured as fraudulent & illegal. There were 17 allegations of uncharged, untrue crimes.
9. The defense lawyer, a PD, refused to both put on necessary exculpatory evidence she had, & to investigate other critical areas, saying "they have no case!"
10. The clearly biased Judge constantly sustained DDA objections & cut off critical cross exam on core issues to guilt or innocence, e.g. 3 CT 771±, 785-787.
