

Michael Goodwin Case Update

January 28, 2020

Michael Goodwin, wrongfully convicted of the murder of Mickey and Trudy Thompson, is awaiting a decision from a state habeas judge in Pasadena, CA, that will probably be made soon.

Goodwin's case for dismissal is based on the following points:

1. The claim by the trial judge that Goodwin orchestrated the murder of Thompson so that he would not have to pay Thompson a previous court judgment, when in fact Goodwin did make the payment.
2. The claim by a neighbor that Goodwin was scoping the place out days before the murder has been refuted by DEA agents that they were actually the ones with the binoculars, reading the license plate numbers of cars coming down the hill. Other DEA agents at the top of the hill were observing all vehicles entering the Thompson residence, which were then radioed to the agents at the bottom of the hill giving the vehicle description. The neighbor testified that it was indeed Goodwin with the binoculars, yet admitted they had only seen him for a few seconds at a considerable distance away over a decade before. Their memory became enhanced after a million-dollar reward was offered and they then decided to step forward.
3. Many lies by the L.A.D.A and the L.A.S.D. that are documented in the court transcript.
4. Goodwin has been denied 90% of his court records that he is entitled to by law in order to properly mount his defense.
5. Evidence that the first two detectives assigned to the case, who refused to go after Goodwin because they found no evidence tying him to the murders, were forced into early retirement.
6. The head juror also stated in an L.A. Times article that they found no evidence tying him to the murders.
7. Three suspects questioned by the L.A.S.D. have testified that they were at the scene of the crime. None were ever arrested as accessories to the crime or tailed to find the other participants.
8. The judge prohibited the introduction by the defense of other suspects in the case, but then told the jury that Goodwin must have done it, because who else could have?

Michael Goodwin is considered to be the father of Supercross. He entered into a business agreement to produce joint events with Mickey Thompson. His case is quite similar to the case of Kris Maharaj, who was set up by a Columbian drug cartel to take the blame for a drug murder:
